Pastoral Relations Committee? What's That?

According to the church constitution, the Pastoral Relations Committee is composed of five members, with the pastor serving *ex-officio*. Three of the members are elected by the congregation for three-year, staggered terms. The other two members are appointed to one-year terms by the pastor but can serve for three consecutive terms.

The committee serves as liaison between the pastor and the congregation. They are to review the Minister-Church Agreement annually and to recommend changes as "desirable and acceptable." Subjects to be considered include financial arrangements, vacation time, and continuing education possibilities. Also of concern to the committee are the pastor's ministerial responsibilities and, especially, overall church leadership.
